

## Book talk Built from the Fire

Join author Victor Luckerson as he recounts the epic history of Tulsa's Greenwood District, often referred to as America's Black Wall Street.

On May 31, 1921, a white mob murdered as many as 300 people and destroyed 35 blocks of a Black neighborhood in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Residents rebuilt, but by the 1970s, urban renewal had nearly emptied the neighborhood again. Today, new high-rises and encroaching gentrification risk wiping out Greenwood's legacy for good.

Though the details differ, there are many similarities between the histories of Greenwood and Rochester's own Clarissa Street.

Victor Luckerson is a journalist and author based in Tulsa who works to bring the neglected Black history to light. He is a former staff writer at The Ringer and business reporter for Time magazine. For more information, visit vicluckerson.com.
